





COVID-19 Protocols

As the safety and health of our guests are our highest priority, the following procedures have been taken to assure the comfort and well-being of our guests:

1. Rapid test checking for all crew on every trip.
2. Temperatures checking for all crew. Anyone registered above 37.5 centigrade or indicate any symptoms of flu and fever would be refrained from working.
3. Temperatures checking for all guests prior to entering the premises. Anyone registered above 37.5 centigrade would be kindly requested to refrain from entering the boat.
4. All crew are required to wear mask, face shield, and hand gloves.
